I'd like you to meet my cats, Sissy and Frank. They're sisters from the same litter of barn cats that lived on a dairy farm. I've had Sissy and Frank a little more than three years—since they were kittens. When I picked the girls up, I was told by the farmer that one cat was a girl and one was a boy. As it turns out, the vet that spayed them could tell their sex more accurately, so now one of my girls has a boy's name.

Personality and activity

Sissy and Frank are best friends. They like to sit in their cat tree together and watch the birds outside on the feeders, play with their toys, and they go crazy for catnip. They're very friendly cats, love to cuddle and purr, and may rub up against you when they meet you. It's their invitation to pet them.

Behavior
