

# PET GO KIT

To be able to evacuate quickly in case of emergency, have these items ready to go for each pet in your family.



## **If it's not safe for you, it's not safe for your pets.**

That's why it's important to make pets part of your emergency planning.

There are many reasons you might need to evacuate, from weather hazards, to earthquake or fire, to a community disaster like a chemical spill.

By developing a plan that includes your pets, you can keep them safe and make sure you have everything ready if you need to leave quickly.


**Use this checklist to create a “pet go kit” so you can grab-and-go while knowing you have all the items your pet needs...**



## TRAVEL ITEMS

- Leash or carrier
- Harness for safe travel

**TIP:** Keep these items by the door so you can leave quickly in case of emergency!





## IDENTIFICATION

- Microchip that's registered with up-to-date contact info
- Collar with pet tag that includes your cell number
- Photo of you and your pet as proof of ownership





## FOOD & DRINKS


- Food and water bowls
- At least 3 days of pet food
- Can opener, if needed
- At least 3 days of water





## COMFORT ITEMS

- Familiar toys for stress relief
- Blanket or pet bed
- Dog waste bags
- or –
- Litter box, litter and scoop





## RECORDS

- Proof of vaccination
- Health records
- Copies of current prescriptions

**TIP:** Keep these items in a waterproof bag





## HEALTH ITEMS

- At least 1 week of current medications and preventatives, e.g. tick treatment
- Instructions in case someone else needs to care for your pet — how much to feed, when, etc.
- First aid kit





## CONTACT INFO

- For your veterinarian
- For local emergency shelters
- For hotels that allow pets
- For pet boarding facilities

## The Benefits of a Pet Emergency Card

Make sure your pets will be cared for in times of need with a pet emergency card.

If something happens to you, a wallet card can alert authorities that you have a pet at home.

If something happens at home when you're away, a window card tells first responders that one or more pets are inside and need help.
